   Person in car shot pedestrian walking a dog. Not associated with homeless. Was an isolated incident.

Captain Donohue

Crime stats: no real clusters, low school burglaries, low residential burglaries (15 in 2 months), on par with commercial, high on vehicle burglaries. Keep your cars empty and locked. 9 robberies in 2 months, low, 2 armed, 7 strong-armed – mostly stealing beer. Aggravated assaults: 24, no clusters. 30 major injury collisions. Traffic Enforcement Unit only 14 for city of 1,000,000 people. Will focus on worst intersection to be determined from data. Fernando: connect Capt. Donohue with Erikson resident who had arrow in roof and broken solar panel (rocks) apparently from Guadalupe River encampments. Bobbi: drug house in neighborhood – report to Capt. Donohue – metro unit can pursue buyer's cars, then metro unit goes to the house. Also consider Responsible Landlord Engagement Initiative, which recently re-started with state funding from Ask Kalra. San Jose Parks and Recs D9 Commissioner Parent of Hacienda student, native garden enthusiast, Thousand Oaks resident. Parks important to us and to wildlife. PRNS does much more than parks – seniors, youth, programs, etc. Viva Calle event this Sunday April 23. Music in the Valley April 30. Family Camp – rustic, low key, lots of activities and all meals included, registration open now and more spots being added soon. 7:45-8:00 Janny Choy Alum Rock Park reopened (limited) from 3 months of closure. Age friendly action plan – programs for seniors including Senior Safari at Happy Hollow. County wide trail master plan update in progress, encouraging residents to complete the survey for that through April 30. Martial Cottle perimeter trail expansion coming. Fortini property recently purchased to expand Santa Teresa Park.
