





Property Owner Responsibility

Financial hardship assistance is available for required work.

Qualification based on Area Median Income (AMI).

- Financial hardship assistance available
- Permitting process
- Complaint and request driven

Tree Emergency Response







What is a tree emergency?

- Imminent hazard in public right of way
- Cracked/hanging limb, tree down, tree splitting
- Obstructing or potential to obstruct roadway, sidewalk, bike lane

Call tree emergencies into Trees and Sidewalks office 408-794-1901

- Winter damage, especially evergreens that hold their foliage
- Summer limb drop hard to predict
- Inspectors out within 1 hours for emergencies
- Property owner responsible to take care of it, or have city do it and bill the property owner

 - Liquidamber roots don't break sewer lines takes advantage of existing leaks – repair broken ceramic sewer line with PVC – have to balance tree canopy
- Still need to get permits even when using vetted vendors – they want to track tree work via permits
- Recommending oak trees suited to southwest climate;
 Zelcovas, Elms provide good canopy and minimal damage
- To prevent concrete damage, ensure full root ball gets deep root watering when starting out
- Nara worked 8 years with Our City Forest and has worked 5 years with the city

- Understood Frustration with Timely Release of Funds Financial Processes Are Challenging
- PRNS is Changing the Structure to Be Less Burdensome for Neighborhood Associations and Simpler for the City
 - \$350k funds distributed this year
 - Execution of debit cards for ~3 orgs that didn't have bank accounts delayed execution for many neighborhood associations

My Assessment The UNSCC Has a Noble Mission and Enabling 501(c)(3) Status New and Empowered Neighborhood Associations are a Key to Quality of Life and Civic Engagement We Have Financial Resources and a Board Open to Cooperative The UNSCC Needs "Bandwidth" – Leaders Willing to Justify and Deliver Programs that Make a Difference. Dave Noel mentioned a potential issue for neighborhood associations getting or keeping bank accounts upcoming law change may require all NAs to register as 501(C)3 and get business licenses in the future. Ty will mention this at a UNSCC board meeting tomorrow to consider adding to their work plan – very high value add; Heather Westh noted that Wells Fargo provided the best info. Wells Fargo told her they will close out current neighborhood association accounts. 
Surveillance - Ticks

- Set mosquito traps
- Monitor mosquito abundance and mosquito species
- Test mosquitoes for diseases
 - West Nile virus (WNV)
 - Western equine encephalitis (WEE)
 - St. Louis encephalitis (SLE)
- Test dead birds



- 144 home inspections (breeding sources, control, and education)
- Provided educational materials to ~250 homes
- "Barrier" treatments
- Wide area larvicide spraying treatment series
 - First treatment: 5/29/24
